How CCBC Grew Online Learning While Supporting Student Progress

Expanding Student Access and Delivering Certificates

The Community College of Baltimore County (CCBC) transforms lives by providing an accessible, affordable, and high-quality education that prepares students for transfer and career success, strengthens the regional workforce, and enriches the community. CCBC is also a member of the Online Course Sharing Consortium of the League for Innovation in the Community College. The League looks for ways to help colleges cultivate student success and persist to completion in achieving their educational goals. As higher education enrollment began to trend downwards through the mid 2010's, CCBC's leaders began to think about ways in which online learning could benefit not only local students, but also students in the region and potentially across the nation.

The Community College of Baltimore County partnered with Acadeum to boost enrollment and to share its mission and robust online programming beyond the Baltimore region. Course sharing has enabled CCBC to better serve students and accomplish strategic initiatives, like growing online learning. CCBC now offers 34 fully online degrees with 30 fully online credit certificates and 13 certificates through continuing education.

Expanding Student Access

As a Teaching Institution within the Acadeum Network, CCBC plans to offer 459 intersessions and full-term Summer and Fall courses. The course offerings include 267 unique courses ranging from general education, lab sciences, languages, and more. In the 2022-23 academic year, CCBC has served 75 students, providing them with seats in education courses they couldn't get because their institution didn't have the enrollments to satisfy the course, the course didn't fit in their schedule, or the student transferred to the institution and needed one course to complete.



Acadeum supports CCBC as they expand access to students. Bilateral agreements within the consortium allow CCBC to facilitate getting students into the course without going through the application and transfer process.
